Dear Parent(s) / Guardian(s),

The Dodgeland School District is excited and pleased to provide a variety of Summer School courses this year. Remedial classes that are intended for students to continue to build/maintain their reading/math skills for the next grade; along with a wide variety of enrichment classes of interest to all students. Hopefully, there will be enough student interest in each course because a sufficient number of students are needed to run each class section. Please note that classes are not guaranteed! If classes fill up, your child might be scheduled into an alternate class.

Teachers will often recommend that a student enroll in Summer School to further develop the skills and abilities needed to carry on the work of the next grade. Parents are urged to give serious thought to such recommendations. Please note that some courses are given preference to students that are recommended for those courses.

Free breakfast and lunch will be provided to each summer school student. Each morning, students can choose a Take-and-Go breakfast starting at 7:35 to eat in their classrooms before school starts at 8am. Lunch will be served at the start of 4th period, and students will eat in their classrooms. (It is important that they indicate whether they are participating in the lunch program during the 1st period so enough lunches are prepared for all students.)

The Summer School program is open to any child entering $4K - 12^{th}$ grade who resides within the boundaries of the Dodgeland School District, or is currently attending Dodgeland through open enrollment.

Registration: Fill out the online registration for 2025 summer school programming on PowerSchool in the parent portal. If you need a parent username/login, please contact the school at (920) 386-4404 ext 1000.

Course Fees: Driver's Education classroom course is free for students that reside within the Dodgeland School District or those enrolled in school choice (open-enrolled) at Dodgeland. The student fee for students outside the district is \$75. Behind the wheel instruction is separate from summer school and does have an additional cost. Behind the wheel is only available for **resident** students.

Students will be given a short "brain break" during classes as needed.

Dress:

Students who are interested in attending just one class may do so, but transportation will not be provided separately. Example: if the class is held during the 1st period, the student could ride the bus to school; but would need to be picked up immediately after the 1st period ended. Or if the class isn't held until the 4th period, transportation would need to be provided to get the student here; but the student could ride the bus home.

Attendance:

- 1st -12th students enrolled in <u>enrichment</u> courses are encouraged to attend all classes.
- Any students enrolled in MS or HS <u>remedial</u> courses for the purpose of promotion/credit <u>must</u> attend all classes, except for illness or emergencies.

Conduct:

Any discipline problem may result in removal from class, and students may be dropped from the class. The following discipline procedure will be followed:

- 1st Warning / Advisory
- 2^{nd} Suspension
- 3^{rd} Removal from summer school

Any student removed from class for discipline and/or attendance reasons will forfeit all fees. Middle school students will not move to the next grade level and high school students will not receive a passing grade.

Health/Emergency Information Sheet:

Parents will need to fill out questions during online registration regarding health/emergency information before their child/children can participate in summer school classes. We may need to contact you or an emergency contact person regarding your child. There will not be a school nurse on site during the summer school session. However, minor medical triage will be available.

Cancellation Policy

Summer School will be canceled if there is a tornado watch or warning in the morning. School cancellations due to weather can be checked at the Dodgeland website, FaceBook, Dodgeland's Bright Arrow messaging program with text and/or email and local media outlets.

"Gear Up" for Middle School (for students entering Grade 6)

Behind the wheel instruction is separate from summer school and is for resident students only.

Fantastic 4K (for students entering Grade 4K) (2 sections)

Mrs. Jenkins / Mrs. Wagner (limit 16 students in each section)

This class will be one session -8:00 AM - 11:55 PM. Students will meet in the classroom at the beginning of each school day when students arrive and go to breakfast as a group after attendance.

This class will let your soon-to-be 4K child dive into some summer fun. We will be reading many great books, creating projects, making new friends, and learning about how the 4K classroom works. Students need to bring a **paint shirt**, a **change of clothes in a labeled zip** –lock bag, along with a daily snack and drink.

Fiction vs. Nonfiction (for students entering Grades 1-2)

Online courses for MS students (for students entering Grades 7-9)
