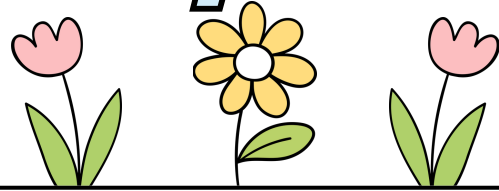

Big thanks to all the parents and families for your support – it means the world!

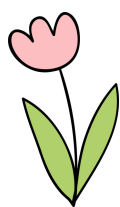

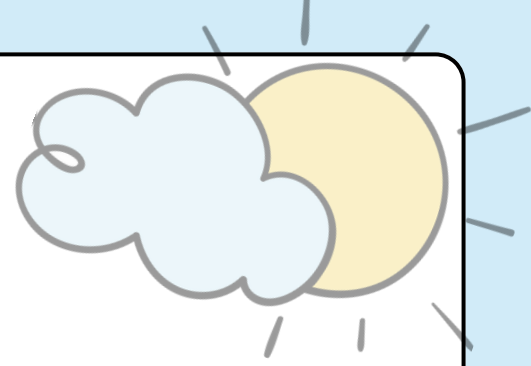

## Bringing Bikes To School:

- Please Help your child remember to:
  - Park their bikes in the bike rack in front of school, use a bike lock if you have one
  - Use the sidewalk around the clinic, DO NOT cut through the parking lot to stay safe from cars backing up
  - During morning and afternoon, WALK bikes/skateboards/E-Scooters when there are more people present to avoid accidents, and especially across both crosswalks

## Summer School:

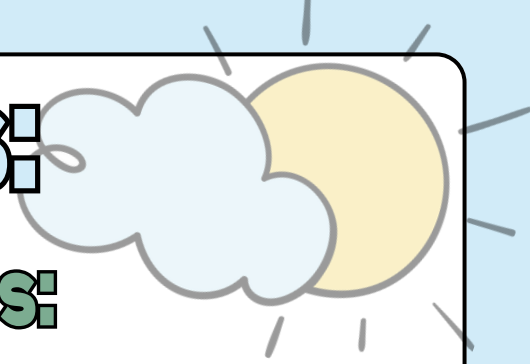
Have you signed up for summer school yet? Registration is open now! Log in to your Parent portal in PowerSchool and register for classes. If you need directions, they are at the link below:

# A Note for Parents!



## After School Pick-up Routines:

To ensure the safety of all our students and staff during the busy dismissal window, please follow these essential guidelines:

- **Stay in Your Vehicle:** If you are using the designated pick-up line, **please remain in your car.** This keeps the line moving efficiently and prevents pedestrians from weaving between idling vehicles.
- **Use the Crosswalks:** If you prefer to meet your child at the door, please park your vehicle in a designated stall in the parking lot. Always use the **marked crosswalks** to reach the building. Avoid cutting through traffic or walking between cars in the pick-up line.
- **Model Safe Habits:** Our students look to you as an example! By using sidewalks and crosswalks, you help reinforce the safety lessons they learn in school.
- **Start the Conversation:** We encourage you to talk with your children about “situational awareness”. Remind them to put away electronics and keep their eyes on the road and drivers while walking through the parking lot or crossing the street.
- **Drivers:** Please be extra attentive and cautious during this busy transition period. We understand kids are excited to leave school and parents have a busy schedule, but our main priority is keeping everyone safe!

# Enhancing Building Security



## VISITOR AWARE

To ensure the continued safety of our students, we have implemented Visitor Aware, a comprehensive visitor management and screening service designed specifically to secure school environments. When you visit, you will be asked to provide a valid, non-expired state-issued photo ID. This system adds a vital layer of protection by validating identities and screening visitors against national sex offender registries and federal watchlists, such as FBI and Interpol lists. Please note that military CAC cards are not accepted due to federal scanning restrictions.

We take your privacy and data security very seriously:

- **Purpose-Driven Data:** Only essential information—such as your name, date of birth, and photo—is collected to manage school visits.
- **Strict Confidentiality:** Your profile is only visible to authorized school personnel and is never sold or shared with outside services.
- **High-Level Encryption:** All data is transferred securely via HTTPS and stored in encrypted databases.
- **Device Security:** Information is completely purged from check-in devices after every use, and only your most recent photo is kept on our secure servers.
- **Limited Scope:** The system is used strictly for safety screening and does not check for warrants, criminal history, or immigration status.

## HOW IT WORKS:

VISITOR AWARE IS A SELF-SERVICE KIOSK POWERED BY AN IPAD, ALLOWING GUESTS TO CHECK IN INDEPENDENTLY. TO GET STARTED, ALL VISITORS WILL NEED TO PROVIDE A PHOTO ID FOR AN INITIAL SCAN. FOR FUTURE VISITS, THE SYSTEM WILL USE FACIAL RECOGNITION TO IDENTIFY THEM QUICKLY.

DURING CHECK-IN, THE SYSTEM WILL PROMPT VISITORS FOR:

- LOCATION THEY ARE VISITING
- REASON FOR THEIR VISIT
- STAFF MEMBER THEY ARE MEETING

ONCE INFORMATION IS SUBMITTED, THE SYSTEM WILL PRINT A VISITOR BADGE FOR THE VISITOR TO WEAR WHILE ON THE SCHOOL PREMISES.

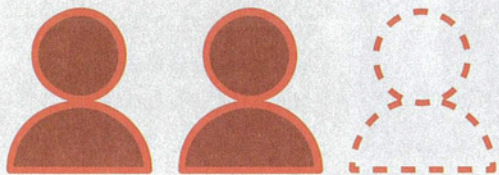
