NOTICE OF EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS**

Per Wisconsin State Statute 115.28(54m), the Dodgeland School District is required to notify parents of the educational options available to students who reside in the district, as well as provide notification of the school's accountability report.

The Dodgeland School District offers students a variety of educational options to children who reside in the district. The District's primary educational pathway and instructional program for students involves a progression from 4-year-old kindergarten (early learning) through 12th grade, leading to a high school diploma.

Educational options for children who reside in the Dodgeland School District, but who are enrolled in and attending a private school or home-based private educational program, include the following:

- Opportunity to attend summer school classes/programs offered in the district.
- Private school students in high school grades have the opportunity to apply for approval to take up to two courses per semester in a District school, pursuant to section 118.145(4) of the state statutes.
- Students who are enrolled in a home-based private educational program have the opportunity to:
 - 1) Apply for approval to take up two courses per semester in public schools as provided under section 118.53.
 - 2) Participate in District interscholastic athletics and other District extracurricular activities as provided under section 118.133.
